A permeable skin of wooden slats filters sunlight, playing with light and shadow inside Casa GAP. The project began with a cross-section design that ensured all the house's volumes would have stunning views of the surrounding landscape. Casa GAP reflects the effort to establish a relationship between horizontal architectural lines and its environment, almost as if the architecture had emerged from the ground itself.

The entire façade is composed of seamless sliding panels. A few refined materials, such as wood, stone, and glass, reaffirm the essence of the project. At sunset, the house becomes entirely transparent to its surroundings, transforming into a luminous box reflected in the pool's water.

Two contrasting finishes define the exterior: a solid stone cladding for the ground floor and wooden slatted panels around the upper volume of the building. These slats not only add texture but also protect the expansive living areas from direct sunlight, enhancing both functionality and aesthetics.
